Numeracy

Number: We will be continuing to promote children's reasoning and fluency in maths.

We have a busy Spring term ahead!

<u>Multiplication and division</u>: Building up knowledge of timetables, using our knowledge of timetables to find related facts, multiplying two digits by 1 with exchange and no exchange, linking multiplication and division and more!

Length and Perimeter

Children will be converting measurements from mm to m, measuring and comparing lengths and learning how to work out the perimeter of a shape will be our focus during this maths topic.

<u>Fraction</u> Children will understand the concept of a whole as being one object/quantity. They will be recognising and finding halves, quarters and thirds.

Mass and Capacity

Children will use scales, measure in grams, add and subtract masses. They will also measure capacity and volume.

<u>Homework</u>— Maths homework will continue to be set using the maths CGP books Please see the homework sheet in the home journals where 2-3 pages will be set over a two week period. Please be aware, if a workbook is lost then a new one will need to be purchased from the school office.



Literacy

Our Author of the term is <u>Benjamin Zephaniah</u>. We will be reading a selection of his books during Destination Reader and Literacy sessions, as well as reading for pleasure as our class novel at the end of each day.


<u>Reading</u>: Once a week your child will read with the class teacher as part of Destination Reader. Children also read in pairs and individually. Home reading books will be changed every Thursday and children will take it home on Friday. We continue to use the Destination Reader programme -where children develop their reading skills under the following headings- Prediction, Clarifying, Asking questions, Making links, Inferring, Summarising and Evaluating.

It is very important that your child reads to you at home. 20 minutes a day is ideal. Please fill in the Champion Reader sheet to encourage good reading habits.

Writing Focus

The children will continue to develop writing across several genres. We will be writing information texts, poetry, Stories by the same author and Newspaper Reports. Children will be learning how to add extra description to their writing using techniques such as fronted adverbials, expanded noun phrases and similes as well as thinking about the thoughts and feelings of our characters.

Spelling: The school follows the Read Write Inc spelling programme published by Oxford Owls. It further develops the skills they have built up during phonics in Key Stage 1. Children learn common spelling patterns and rules during a 15 minute session each day. Alongside this, children also learn to spell words that do not fit into spelling patterns.



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PHSE & RE

Each week children will consider a Key Benthal Value and this will be discussed and developed through either; School Assemblies, Class Assemblies, Circle Time or discrete subject lessons.

<u>PSHE:</u>

In PSHE we will be learning about 'Aiming High'. They will focus on goals and aspirations and discuss some achievements they have accomplished so far and the type of attitude that helps them succeed. In the second half term we will be learning about 'Be Yourself', where it will enable children to identify their strengths and achievements as well as help them recognise different emotions they experience.



<u>RE:</u>

Our RE topic for the first half term is Judaism. We will be exploring the topic 'Who are the Jews?'. We will explore how Judaism started and how Jews in the diaspora keep their identity. For the second half term our topic is 'How do the features of a mosque help Muslims to pray?' We will be revisiting the five pillars of Islam and then describing the features of a mosque (inside and outside) and explain why Muslims wash before they pray.





This term, we will be using Purple Mash to create and use PowerPoints. Children will be using Microsoft PowerPoints to create documents, present their work and more.

Spring

SCIENCE

Our science topic for this term is Rocks and Soil. We will be learning about different types of rocks and how they are formed. The properties of different types of rocks, how soil is made, what fossils are and how they are formed.



Physical Education

PE is on every Monday afternoon and every other Friday. They will be learning Basketball on Mondays and Gymnastics on Thursdays. A majority of lessons will take place in the outdoor areas in the playground so please remember appropriate outdoor clothing i.e. jogging bottoms for cold weather.

The children **need** to bring in PE clothing. This consists of: a <u>white t shirt, black shorts or jogging bottoms</u> <u>and black trainers or plimsolls.</u>

<u>Spanish</u>

In Spanish the children will be studying, numbers up to 31, days of the week, months of the year and how to say their birthday.



BCC Benthal Creative Curriculum

Our BCC topic for this term is 'Is all of Europe the same?'. We will be identifying the different places closer to home when looking at Europe and become familiar with some of the places they will be seeing when they learn about ancient civilisations who lived there.



Home learning Projects

Homework will be handed out in the form of 6 week blocks. The children hand in their books (home learning journal, maths book and SPaG book) every two weeks on their Friday due date which can be found on their homework task block sheet stuck in their learning journals.

They complete one section over a course of two weeks including one task from their 'project challenge' and 'chatter time' topics.
