CURRICULUM NEWS

Nursery—in Cherry (our 2-year old nursery class) we have been settling in and enjoying our wonderful new classroom! Please contact the school office if you have a 2-year old who would like a morning place from 9-12.



Mulberry—In Mulberry nursery we have been learning about different types of transport. We have really enjoyed the story 'Please Don't Chat to the Bus Driver'

We have used large cardboard boxes to make our own bus and car to play in and have created a new display for our classroom wall.



Year 2—Elder class have been writing their very own stories! The children learnt about the features of a narrative and have included them in their stories.

Year 3 - In our Science lessons, year 3 have been learning about rocks. Children have been deeply fascinated and have exhibited genuine scientific curiosity in our outdoor environment.

15-hours funded childcare for 2-Year Olds

Parents who work and earn the equivalent of 16 hours a week at the national Minimum Wage and earn less than £100,00 adjusted net income per year, are entitled to 30 hours free childcare a week for children aged three to four. Please use the link below to apply

Now Benthal 2 year old nursery is open from 9am-12pm for entitled children e.g. Income support; job seekers allowance, employment & support allowance; tax credits; universal credit; NASS Support; working tax credit. 2 year olds can also get free childcare if they are looked after by a local council, they have an EHC plan; Disability Living allowance or they have left care under a special guardianship order, child arrangements order or residence order.

From April 2024, the funding for 15hrs for 2 year olds will extend to working parents.

Your child will turn 2 years old before 1st of April 2024; You earn at least £8,670 a year and less than £100,000 a year adjusted net income, which is your income after some tax reliefs and deductions; If you are a couple you both will need to earn between these amounts.

We will have part-time (morning and afternoon) and full -time nursery places from April 2024 in our 2-year old nursery, so please apply early to secure your preferred session.
